



MOLECULAR GENETICS AND GENOMICS

Accelerated GRADuate Enrollment (AGRADE) APPLCATION

Students entering their final year of undergraduate coursework at WSU may apply to enter the Molecular Genetics and Genomics (MGG) Master's Graduate program under the AGRADE status provided they meet the following requirements:

- Minimum overall 3.3 overall GPA and 3.6 major GPA
- The earliest date by which a student may apply for the AGRADE program is during the semester in which they complete 90 credits toward the undergraduate degree.
- A maximum of 16 credits may be applied towards both undergraduate and graduate degrees
- Fulfill all other AGRADE prerequisites as outlined in the WSU Graduate Bulletin (www.bulletins.wayne.edu)
- Submit AGRADE Application form along with a one-page statement of purpose outlining the student's motivation for entering the MGG AGRADE program and short-term and long-term academic goals.
- Submit the MGG AGRADE Plan of Work signed by the undergraduate Academic Advisor and Graduate Program Officer verifying student eligibility
